VORTEX Consortium Meeting in Frankfurt and Marburg (27.02. – 1.03.2024)



An in-person reunion of the VORTEX consortium took place from February 27 to March 1 at the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt (PRIF). At the heart of the event were the refined project plans of our doctoral candidates, who sought feedback from their supervisors and other VORTEX consortium members. These were framed by a program of lectures focused on research designs and methodology, thus supporting the doctoral candidates in concretizing their projects. Julian Junk delivered a presentation on research designs, and Thorsten Bonacker discussed the function and position of theory in such research designs. Regina Ammicht-Quinn and Marco Krüger, serving as VORTEX Ethics Advisors, once again

prompted reflection on the ethical challenges of the doctoral projects - after all, they all deal with debated concepts such as radicalization, extremism, or terrorism.

The discussion on research design and methodology was rounded off by the keynote address of our external guest, Lorne L. Dawson from the University of Waterloo, who spoke about a matrix of methodological issues in the study of violent extremism. The consortium furthermore welcomed Garth Davies from Simon Fraser University.

On February 29, the entire consortium was hosted at Philipps University Marburg. The extensive program included a lecture by Julia Schulte-Cloos on right-wing authoritarian attitudes, fast-paced decision-making, and the spread of misinformation about COVID-19 vaccines, but also included a city tour for our guests.

Finally, the meeting provided an opportunity to discuss joint research possibilities and exchange ideas. Many thanks to all participants - we look forward to the next virtual meeting in Marburg in August 2024.
