News from VORTEX doctoral candidates



Laura Stritzke is currently completing her secondment at the <u>Violence Prevention Network</u> (VPN) in Berlin, where she has been warmly welcomed by the science department. During her time there, she has gained valuable insights into projects related to the possibilities of evaluation and monitoring in extremism prevention work, benefiting from the continuous exchange between research and practice.

Her work has focused particularly on enhancing the applicability and usefulness of feedback methods in prevention practice. To achieve this, she has designed and adapted pedagogical feedback tools tailored to the specific working contexts and conditions of prevention practitioners. This process has been shaped by work shadowing and the implementation of a dedicated workshop, ensuring that the methods are both practical and relevant.

At the same time, her involvement at VPN has deepened her connection to key discussions and prevention practice related to her dissertation research.



Rohan Stevenson spent his secondment at the Philipps-University Marburg, where he continued working on his dissertation on the problem representation of rightwing extremism in multiple countries in Europe and sharpened his focus on Germany in particular. As part of this, he visited the Research Group on Radicalisation at the Peace Research Institute Frankfurt (PRIF) for a discussion on the understanding of right-wing extremism among policymakers in Germany. Critically reviewing concepts such as 'wehrhafte Demokratie' and 'gesellschaftliche Mitte' from a constructivist and critical race theory perspective, Rohan suggested a rethinking of right-wing extremism by engaging with concepts of 'white supremacy' and 'vigilantism' instead. Since many researchers of the research group working closely on societal, political, and legal discourses surrounding violent extremism in Germany, Rohan's presentation was received with great interest.

Research Output

There is nothing to report here since the last newsletter, but that does not mean that nothing is happening at VORTEX! We are working on exciting projects, so stay tuned.
